OVERVIEW

INTRODUCTION

The Graduate Follow-Up Survey gathers data annually regarding the activities and opinions of students approximately six months after their graduation from Wisconsin's Technical Colleges. The primary objective of the survey is to: Identify the current activities of program graduates; to determine the extent to which current activities are related to the graduates' educational programs; provide feedback for career awareness and planning efforts and data to facilitate program planning, evaluation and development.

METHODOLOGY

The 16 colleges in the Wisconsin Technical College System surveyed their program graduates. A total of 27,186 graduates received surveys with 18,036 responding, resulting in a response rate of 66%. A copy of the survey instrument is included as Appendix A. Basic concepts and measures used throughout the report are defined below.

Much of the information in this report summarizes the responses of graduates who were in the labor force. The labor force includes all employed and unemployed respondents except those who are unemployed and not seeking employment. A person is considered employed if he or she works for pay or profit, full or part time, at the time of the survey. Full time employment is defined as 35 or more hours per week; part-time is less than 35 hours per week.

The survey asked respondents to classify their jobs as related or not related to the training they received. In the data tables beginning on page 7, those who indicate their job is related to their training are counted in the employed-related category, a subset of the employed category.

The median salary for graduates of a given program is calculated based on respondents who are employed full-time in jobs related to their training. The median salary is the mid-point of salaries reported with half of the salaries below and half above the mid-point. A minimum of four employed-related respondents must have reported their salary in order for it to be published.

DEMOGRAPHIC COMPOSITION OF 2010 WTCS GRADUATES

The following table shows the sex and ethnicity of all of the 27,186 graduates by type of degree granted and by instructional division. There are 7,654 more females than males. Minorities represented 10.74% of all graduates, while 5.43% of the graduates did not report their ethnicity. (Please note N/R means Not Reported.)

AGE GROUPS OF GRADUATES

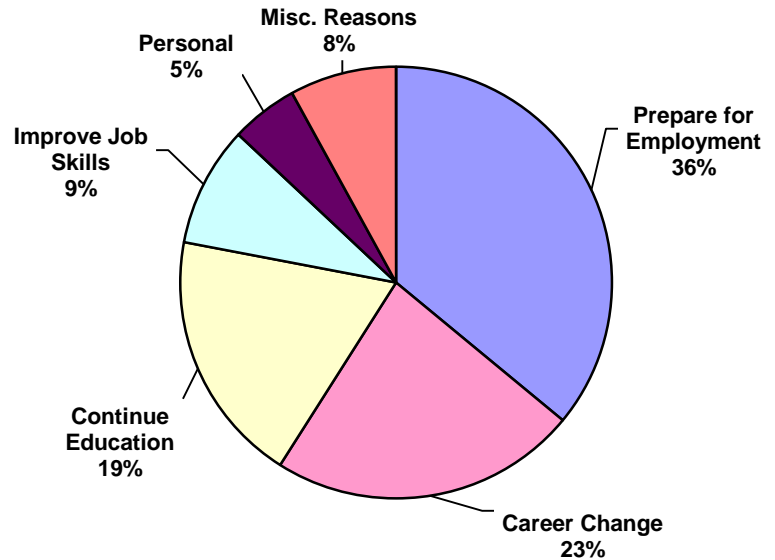
The largest number of graduates (8,055) is in the 20-24 year age group, which represents 29.63% of the total.

REASONS FOR ATTENDING

Preparing for employment continues to be the top reason for attending a Wisconsin Technical College. Thirty-six percent (36%) of respondents said the reason they enrolled was to prepare for employment. The other reasons were:

- 23% career change
- 19% continue education
- 9% improve job skills
- 5% personal reasons
- 8% misc. reasons



GRADUATES RATE THEIR TRAINING

Ninety-seven percent (97%) of the graduates responding indicated that they were satisfied or very satisfied with their training. This rating has remained consistent for the last nine years.

EMPLOYMENT STATUS

Of the 14,183 respondents who indicated they are in the labor force, 88% are employed and 12% are seeking employment.

Those not in the work force cited the following reasons:

- 83% were continuing their education;
- 5% had full-time family responsibilities;
- 2% were disabled;
- 6% gave other reasons, and;
- 4% gave no reason.

FOR THE PAST FOURTEEN YEARS...

The percentage of graduates employed within six months has been 86% or higher (88% this year) with 71% in fields related to their education.

EMPLOYMENT

RELATED TO TRAINING

Within the group of employed graduates, 71% were in a job related to the training they received, 28% reported that their job is not related to the training received and one percent did not indicate if their employment is related to their training.

BY INSTRUCTIONAL DIVISION

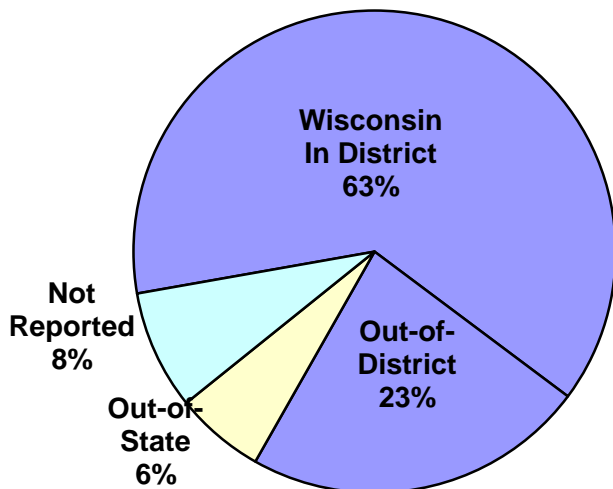
Statewide in all instructional areas, 71% of the employed graduates who responded to the survey obtained employment in occupations related to their training. The chart below shows the percent of those employed related for each instructional area from the highest percentage employed related (Agribusiness) to lowest (Service).

WHEN EMPLOYED

Of the 12,515 respondents who reported being employed, 55% said they became employed after their technical college training; 23% indicated they were employed before they enrolled; 19% said they got a job while they were attending technical college; and 3% did not indicate when they became employed.

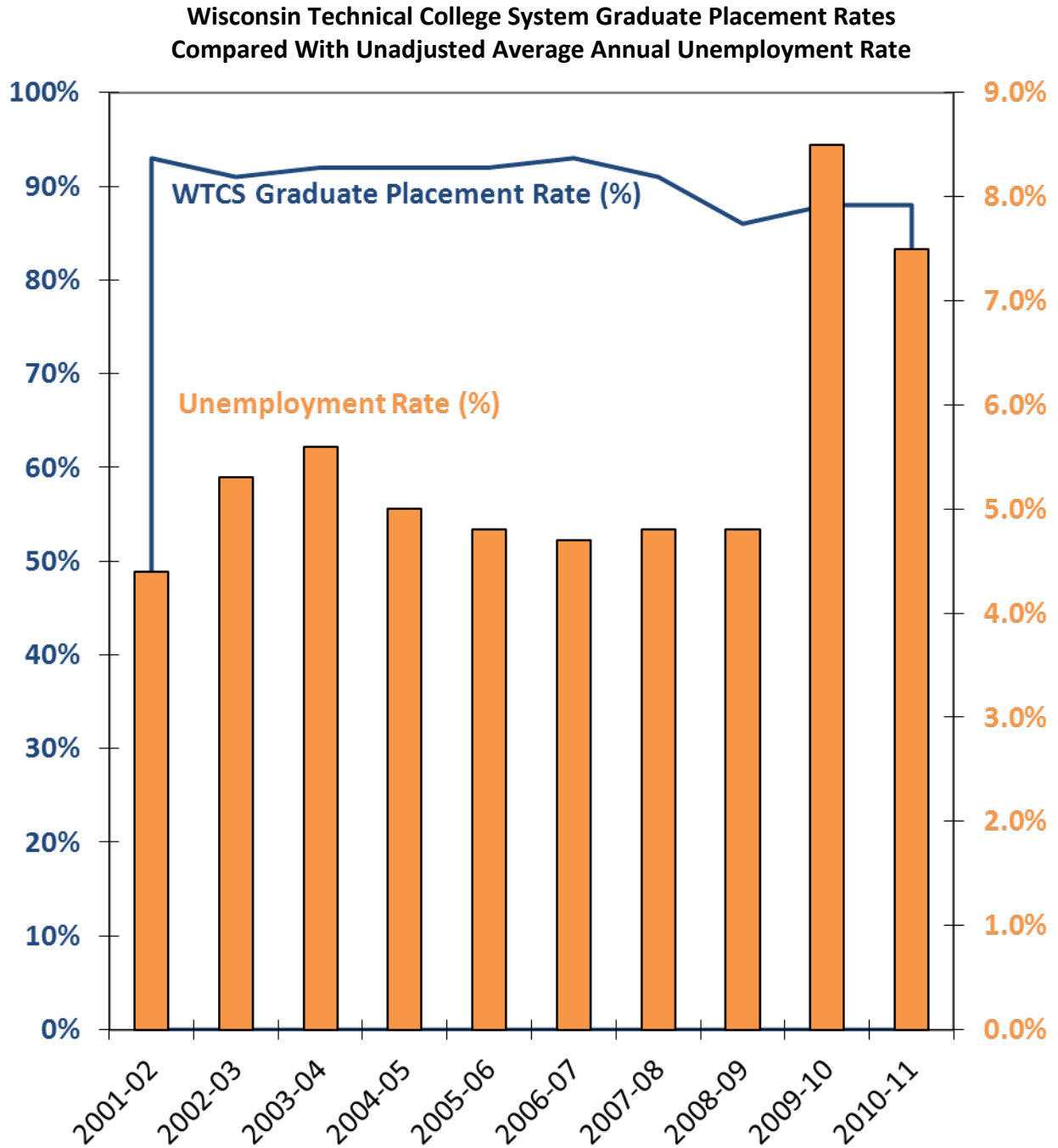
EMPLOYMENT LOCATION



Technical college graduates overwhelmingly stay to live and work in Wisconsin and contribute to the state's economy. Eighty-six percent of the employed graduates who responded to the survey are working in Wisconsin (63% are employed in the technical college district where they received their training and 23% are employed in another district) six percent are employed out-of-state and eight percent did not indicate where they are employed.

GRADUATE PLACEMENT RATES

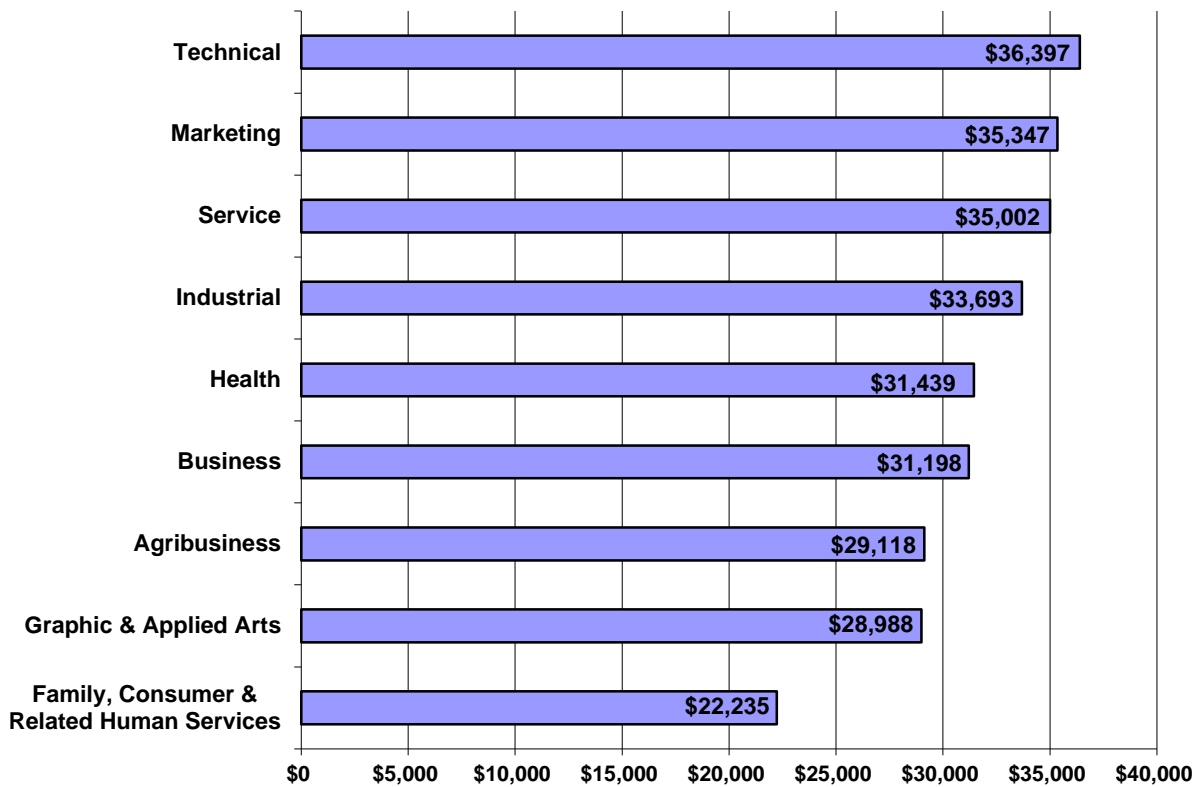
The graph below illustrates that Wisconsin Technical College Graduates continue to show a high placement rate regardless of the unemployment rate. The placement rate has remained at 86% or higher (88% this year) over the last ten years.



MEDIAN ANNUAL SALARIES

The information below shows median annual salaries in each instructional division as well as by the type of occupational degree granted. The median salary reflects the mid-point of all salaries reported for each instructional division. Salary figures are based only on those respondents who report being employed full-time in occupations related to their training. The median annual salary for all 2011 technical college graduates is \$31,822.
